### John 3:1-15

- <sup>1</sup> Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a member of the Jewish ruling council.
- <sup>2</sup> He came to Jesus at night and said, "Rabbi, we know you are a teacher who has come from God. For no one could perform the miraculous signs you are doing if God were not with him."
  - <sup>3</sup> In reply Jesus declared, "I tell you the truth, no one can see the kingdom of God unless he is born again."
- <sup>4</sup> "How can a man be born when he is old?" Nicodemus asked. "Surely he cannot enter a second time into his mother's womb to be born!"
- <sup>5</sup> Jesus answered, "I tell you the truth, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless he is born of water and the Spirit. <sup>6</sup> Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit. <sup>7</sup> You should not be surprised at my saying, 'You must be <u>born again</u>.' <sup>8</sup> The wind blows wherever it pleases. <sup>16</sup> "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. <sup>17</sup> For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. <sup>18</sup> Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe stands condemned already because he has not believed in the name of God's one and only Son.

### Matthew 12:38-41

Then some of the Pharisees and teachers of the law said to him, "Teacher, we want to see a miraculous sign from you."

<sup>36</sup> [Jesus] answered, "A wicked and adulterous generation asks for a miraculous sign! But none will be given it except the sign of the prophet Jonah. <sup>40</sup> For as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of a huge fish, so the Son of Man will be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth. <sup>41</sup> The men of Nineveh will stand up at the judgment with this generation and condemn it; for they repented at the preaching of Jonah, and now one greater than Jonah is here.

**John 1:1, 2, 14, 17** [The 'Word' is defined. Follow the progressive elaboration from the Word, to One full of grace and truth, to Jesus.]

<sup>1</sup> In the beginning was the <u>Word</u>, and the <u>Word</u> was with God, and the <u>Word</u> was God. <sup>2</sup> He was with God in the beginning. . .

<sup>14</sup> The <u>Word</u> became flesh [became a baby] and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the <u>One</u> and Only, who came from the Father, full of <u>grace and truth</u>. . . <sup>17</sup> For the law was given through Moses; <u>grace and truth</u> came through <u>Jesus Christ</u>.

#### John 6:47

[Jesus was teaching,] "I tell you the truth, he who believes [me] has everlasting life."

1 Corinthians 15:12-21 [Paul argued in his 1st Letter to the Corinthians that if Christ's Resurrection did not occur, then our faith is futile. But Praise the Lord – it occurred! Jesus was raised from the dead!]

<sup>12</sup> But if it is preached that Christ has been raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? <sup>13</sup> If there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. <sup>14</sup> And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith. <sup>15</sup> More than that, we are then found to be false witnesses about God, for we have testified about God that he raised Christ from the dead. But he did not raise him if in fact the dead are not raised. <sup>16</sup> For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised either. <sup>17</sup> And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins. <sup>18</sup> Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ are lost. <sup>19</sup> If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are to be pitied more than all men.

<sup>20</sup> But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. <sup>21</sup> For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man.
