"We should approach God in reverential awe. He, who is the great "I AM!", required Moses to remove his sandals before approaching the burning bush and the surrounding "holy" ground (Exodus 3:2-6). [Continued (ψ)]

"Philippians 2:9-11 provides this insight to an event that will occur, without doubt, at a time future to this writing:
9 Therefore, God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name,
10 that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth,
11 and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."

"Imagine the millions/billions of people this includes: every person from Adam and Eve to those born in the future; including Believers, Americans, Chinese, Russians, Brazilians, Indians (India), Arabs, indigenous natives, Jewish priests, Muhammad (founder of Islam), Islamic Imams, Buddhists, serfs in the Middle Ages, movie stars, avowed atheists, Adolph Hitler, kings, queens, pharaohs, Satan's demons, and Satan himself. Then, quickly looking around, we see all of these people, including Satan, falling to their knees, and bowing. We hear a chorus of voices — <u>all</u> voices, <u>all</u> tongues, in unison, speaking aloud, and clearly confessing, clearly proclaiming . . . "Jesus Christ is LORD"! [My imagination, my words are so inadequate to describe this event.]

"Why do we provide such obeisance, loyalty, fealty, and honor to human kings, queens, presidents, and celebrities, when God, when Jesus, is the <u>Creator</u> of the universe. (See John 1:1-3 \uparrow ; Genesis 1:26: "us" ψ .) While the self-righteous pride of the self-important person may demand a subordinate to genuflect before him or her and to pledge absolute fealty, that prideful person was also created by God, just as you and I were created. (See Psalm $139:16^b \psi$)

"How should we approach the God of the universe, Jesus? Trembling. Yes, trembling because we know our sins and how we should be judged. [Frankly, many years ago I think God should have judged me for my many sins, found me so guilty, and 'smoked' me . . . Thank You God, thank You Jesus for Your forgiveness and Your gift of eternal life through Christ Jesus!] And confident, because we know that Jesus so loved you and me that He willingly died a horrible death to redeem (atone) us from our sins. With our head bowed, because God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit are deserving of our worship, honor, love, devotion, reverence, and fidelity. Lastly, in awe, because we believe in the Redeemer – Christ Jesus of Nazareth – and as such you and I are included in the Lamb's Book of Life [see Revelation 21:27]; we are worshippers in the body of Believers, His Church, His bride. 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty, who was, and is, and is to come.' [Revelation 4:8b (NIV-1984)] Amen.

- There are several profound takeaways from this Matthew passage in which Jesus is tempted in the desert.
 - (1) In Jesus' third temptation (verses 8 & 9), Jesus never refutes Satan's ownership of the world, and from that we can infer that, while God has retained ultimate authority over Satan and this world, God allows Satan to 'manage' this world, to 'own' this world. By relinquishing direct ownership/management of this world, God has thereby given us human beings free-choice, the freedom to choose God and to love Him through our embrace of the Lord Christ Jesus, who died for your sins and my sins through a death that may have been the most barbaric, pain-inducing, prolonged execution ever devised at least to this date in history.
 - (2) Jesus uses Scripture to refute Satan's temptations, specifically, Jesus quotes verses from the Book of Deuteronomy, which is the 5th book of the Jewish Pentateuch (also called the Torah; the five books of the Pentateuch begin the Old Testament of our Holy Bible). Yes, there is power in Scripture; and there is a lesson for you and for me as we follow Christ Jesus' example and use our knowledge of Scripture to reject and renounce worldly temptations.
 - (3) Within Matthew's chronicle, Jesus successfully rejected Satan's three basic temptations: selfishness, pride, and lust. Jesus rejected each temptation! (See more in Lesson 1 of the Mark Study: *Mark 1:1-13 and Matthew 4:1-11*; https://trinitybereans.org/2022Mark/Mark-01-01-13.pdf.)

Luke 10:18 [NIV-1984]

[Jesus provided this observation. While we do not know when this occurred relative to the Creation or Jesus' ministry on this earth, Jesus testified that it did occur — God tossed the evil, prideful, selfish Satan from Heaven.]

He replied, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven.

Job 1:6-10 [International Children's Bible (ICB)]

[The following exchange occurs in the Book of Job and provides insight to the relationship between God and Satan.]

⁶ One day the angels came to show themselves before the Lord. Satan also came with them. ⁷ The Lord said to Satan, "Where have you come from?"

Satan answered the Lord, "I have been wandering around the earth. I have been going back and forth in it."

- ⁸ Then the Lord said to Satan, "Have you noticed my servant, Job? No one else on earth is like him. He is an honest man and innocent of any wrong. He honors God and stays away from evil."
- ⁹ But Satan answered God, "Job honors God for a good reason. ¹⁰ You have put a wall around him, his family, and everything he owns. You have blessed the things he has done. So, his flocks of sheep and herds of cattle are large. They almost cover the land.

body"; which is but one, consisting of many members in union with each other, set in their proper places in just symmetry and proportion to each other, and subservient to one another, and are neither more nor fewer; see 1 Corinthians 12:12 (Ψ)" [©about 1760, Exposition of the Entire Bible by John Gill. Isaiah 53:5 [International Children's Bible (ICB)]

[The prophet Isaiah foretold of the corporal punishment to which the Messiah would be subjected on behalf of all Believers. Christ Jesus was falsely accused, stripped, flogged, crowned with a chaplet of thorns which was pushed-down on His head lacerating His scalp, mocked, spat upon, beaten with a staff, forced to carry His cross as He trudged to the crucifixion site, and then crucified.]

But he was wounded for the wrong things we did. He was crushed for the evil things we did. The punishment, which made us well, was given to him. And we are healed because of his wounds.

Isaiah 53:5 [King James Version (KJV)]

[Many people have heard or read this verse in the older language of the King James Version.]

But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes [tearing cuts to the skin from flogging] we are healed.

An analogy.

I died, and I'm standing before the Judge – the Lord God Almighty. The prosecuting attorney is Satan and, while he paces back-and-forth before the Judge's bench, he lists every one of my sins in excruciating detail emphasizing the people I had hurt. I am standing, downcast, and feeling deep, sorrowful shame as I listen to all of the sins I committed, the people I had hurt, the people to whom I had failed to minister or to share the Gospel of Salvation, and the impact and consequences of my words, actions, and inactions upon those people. I am in anguish over the pain I caused. Eventually, Satan completes his recitation of the list of my sins, and rests his case.

The Judge turns to my attorney Christ Jesus and asks Him for my defense.

Christ Jesus simply states, "My Father, the list of charges, the sins, is accurate. The defendant is guilty. The defense rests."

The Judge then states, "My judgment is just. The defendant sinned. The consequence for sin is death. Are there any last words?"

Christ Jesus quietly addresses the Judge, "I know this person by name. I paid the penalty for this person's sins. Please free this person."

The Judge turns to me and lovingly says, "My child, your sins are forgiven. You are free to go."

Romans 10:8-17 [NIV-1984]

[In Paul's Letter to the Romans, he makes the following declaration that summarizes how an unbeliever comes to faith in Christ Jesus. The new Believer's faith depends upon a mature Believer who has willingly become the feet, hands, and mouth of our Savior by demonstrating a Christ-like behavior, gaining the unbeliever's trust, and proclaiming the Gospel at the prompting of the Holy Spirit.]

⁸ But what does it say? "The word is near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart [Deuteronomy 30:14]," that is, the word of faith we are proclaiming: ⁹ That if you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved.

¹¹ As the Scripture says, "Anyone who trusts in him will never be put to shame." ¹² For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile — the same Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on him, ¹³ for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

¹⁴ How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? ¹⁵ And how can they preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!" ¹⁶ But not all the Israelites accepted the good news. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed our message?"
